- Earn a minimum of 44 credits
- Meet core class requirements
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA in academics and citizenship

A-G REQUIREMENTS

Core UC 'a-g' Course Requirements

6 credits (3 years) History/Social Science

8 credits (4 years) English

6 credits (3 years) Mathematics

- Integrated Math I
- Integrated Math II
- Integrated Math III or advanced mathematics course

6 credits (3 years) Science

4 credits (2 years) Language Other Than English (World Language)

2 credits (1 year), UC "f" -approved Visual and Performing Arts

The required UC 'g' elective is fulfilled by satisfying the district's requirement for a third year of science. No additional college prep elective is required for graduation.

Total: 32 credits

Additional Requirements (High School)

4 credits (2 years) Physical Education (Fitnessgram required). Students who do not pass five out of six Healthy Fitness Zones on the Fitnessgram must enroll in physical education courses until an overall passing score is obtained.









